Coach Wayne Ramsey comes to the LWR Chargers SC with many years of experience. Coach Ramsey is currently the Head Girls Soccer Coach for the Out of Door Academy. Ramsey was the Head Coach for the Monmouth University Division 1 Men's Program and he was the Head Coach of the NJ Stallions Professional Team. He also holds a Master's Degree in Education.

"Adding Coach Ramsey to our coaching staff will help our Goalkeepers develop the skills they need" said Antonio Saviano LWR Chargers SC Technical Director. "He brings a wealth of experience with his time as a head coach for various programs and he was a Goalkeeper himself and definitely understands what our Goalkeepers need to keep building and improving their skills.

As a player Coach Ramsey was a standout goalkeeper for the TCNJ's men's soccer team from 1979 to 1982. He was the starting goalkeeper for four seasons and averaged less than a goal per game allowed in each of those three seasons. He was an all-conference performer during the 1980 season allowing only 15 goals in 16 games. He was inducted in the TCNJ Hall of Fame in 2010.
